



The Göteborg Opera announces its 2022/23 season

The Göteborg Opera announces its 2022/23 season with three new productions Smetana's *The Bartered Bride*, Offenbach's *Les contes d'Hoffmann*, Verdi's *Nabucco* and the premiere of an opera based on Åsa Lind's book for children, *Sandvargen* (*The Sand Wolf*).



Artistic Director Opera/Drama **Henning Ruhe** shares some insight on this season's theme:

"Many of these works share a strong common theme: How do we choose the person we want to share our life with, and how free is our choice? This is a question posed by many of our main characters this season...Although these works may differ widely from each other, they are all populated by strong characters, multifaceted individuals who break loose, rebel, raise their voices or find their own paths."





The Bartered Bride (17 Sep -25 Oct 2022)




Mellika Melouani Melani directs Smetana's exuberant opera *The Bartered Bride*. In her modern production, Melani dusts off this Czech national-romantic opera and imbues it with punky love, strong desires and violent rebellion against traditional norms. She was the artistic director at Folkoperan (Swedish Folk Opera) in Stockholm and is known for radical productions. Her staging of *Carmina Burana* with seven 80 year old ladies on stage was a massive hit for

three years and played at the Stockholm Globe Arena (nowadays called Avicii Arena).

With a libretto in Swedish by Fredrik Fischer and Linnea Schunnesson, Melani presents a radical modern interpretation inspired by the suburbs in Stockholm and Göteborg.

In a run-down neighbourhood, desires are simmering. The summer heat is driving people crazy with passion, life and desire. They love, they fight, they make plans and deals. The young Mařenka, is passionately in love with a stranger called Jeník. But their love is under threat. Mařenka's parents want to marry her off to the wealthy Vašek in order to pay off a debt. He questions his sexuality when a queer circus arrives in town in a worn-down society where people do anything for money.



The production is led by the internationally successful conductor **Alevtina Ioffe**, who in recent years has attracted a lot of attention at, among others, Seattle Opera, Bayerische Staatsoper, and Komische Oper, marking her Swedish debut.





Les contes d'Hoffmann (The Tales of Hoffmann) - (26 Nov 2022 — 15 Jan 2023)



Young Polish director Krystian Lada presents a new take on Offenbach's opéra fantastique Les contes d'Hoffmann, which explores the mysteries of love. Lada has created a production of Les d'Hoffmann with which everyone can easily identify.

The opera opens when beloved Stella has abandoned Hoffmann and he drowns his sorrows in alcohol while reminiscing on the past. What led to this breakup? In his bereaved state, reality and fantasy merge together. As with any couple, Hoffmann's relationship with Stella requires constant decisions to be made in the best interests of the individuals, their relationship and their careers.

The real-life Hoffmann was primarily famous for his humorous fantasy stories. In *Les contes d'Hoffmann* (The Tales of Hoffmann), Hoffmann is the main character in three of his own stories. Sublime soprano **Kerstin Avemo** portrays the three women whom Hoffmann has loved and subsequently lost under bizarre circumstances. Each of the women– the perfect Olympia, the ambitious Antonia and the dramatic Giulietta– represent aspects of one and the same woman.

The role of Hoffmann is sung by three tenors of different ages **Tomas Lind** (Old Hoffmann), **Joachim Bäckström** (Middle-aged Hoffmann) and **Brian Michael Moore** (Young Hoffmann).

French conductor **Sébastien Rouland** has conducted the opera several times, most recently in Tokyo.

Les contes d'Hoffmann is a love story where the burlesque meets the grotesque. It exists in a number of versions and no one knows Offenbach's real intentions for the work. He died a month before the opera opened with the score in his hand and never saw his life's project become reality. This production is based on the latest version from Offenbach's original score.

The Sandvargen (The Sand Wolf)- 16 September- 27 November 2022







This autumn the Göteborg Opera will perform a children's opera based on Åsa Lind's book The Sandvargen (The Sand Wolf). This world written by Johanna premiere is Fridolfsson (violist from the Göteborg orchestra) and Malin Aghed and directed by Emelie Sigelius. This one act opera is based on a story about a character called Zaccarina who lives in a house by the sea with her parents. From the sand on the beach, she digs up a new friend: the clever Sandwolf. Together they explore life's big

questions, with the participation from the audience. The production will go on tour throughout the region of Västra Götaland.

Nabucco (20 May-10 June 2023)



Conductor **Giancarlo Andretta** returns to the Göteborg Opera to conduct Verdi's passionate breakthrough opera *Nabucco*. Director **Jacopo Spirei** sets the biblical story in a contemporary context with a desperate populace protesting against an oppressive government. The Göteborg Opera's baritone **Mats Persson** performs

the title role Nabucco, whose perceptions of himself and society change as the plot develops.

THE GÖTEBORG OPERA

The Göteborg Opera in its modern venue designed by Jan Izikowitz of Lund and Valentin was opened in October 1994. It seats 1,300 and boasts a state of the art acoustic, enhanced by special egg-tempera acoustic paint (which used 6,000 eggs). There is even space for a hidden chorus in the circular lighting rig in the middle of the auditorium. The building houses all the carpentry, metal and wood workshops for mounting full productions from the creation of



the sets and props, to costumes, wigs and prosthetics with the latest environmentally-aware technology (such as an ozone cabinet to clean delicate costumes and 600 sq m of solar panels on the roof). The orchestra and chorus are fully adaptable for opera, dance and musicals and the diverse programme allows for the audience to experiment with all three art forms, with a quarter regularly attending all three with little sign of the snobbery normally associated with opera.
